Sylvia's Royal Appointment

Friday 4th December 2009 is a very important day for Sylvia Smith because she will be travelling with her son and two of her daughters to Buckingham Palace, to collect her OBE (Order of the British Empire Medal).

Sylvia was notified of her award in June when the Queen announced her Birthday Honours List following the nomination by the Turtles Club.

The Turtles Club was founded in 1964 and Sylvia attended the club from the outset as a 'young' Red Cross poolside volunteer. Her award is for her 45 years of dedication and commitment to the development of swimming for those with disabilities, not just for the Turtles but also at a national level through the NASCH organisation (National Association of Swimming Clubs for the Handicapped)

Sylvia was appointed to the position of President of NASCH in 2007. Prior to this time, Sylvia was the Vice President of NASCH (from 1999 to 2007) and Vice Chairman from 1991 to 1998. From 1976 to 1988 Sylvia was the NASCH Social Secretary.

Sylvia Smith has therefore become synonymous with the development of swimming for those with disabilities on a national level. Through NASCH, Woodlarks and the various swimming galas, Sylvia has worked tirelessly to ensure that everyone enjoys themselves, can participate in new opportunities and events and in doing so optimise their abilities in an equitable and challenging environment.



As a former primary school teacher and later as a teacher for the deaf and hard of hearing, Sylvia has dedicated her life to those that are less fortunate than herself.

The OBE is richly deserved, so enjoy your day at the Palace Sylvia!

Uxbridge Pool

The new Uxbridge Pool is on schedule to be open by March 2010. The Turtles Club intend to remain at Highgrove and not switch to the new pool. The committee has met with Hillingdon Council and Fusion (Management Company) and we hope to secure some additional swimming time for disabled groups at the new 50 metres pool.

Hillingdon Swimming Club

We are co-operating with Hillingdon Swimming Club regarding the development of the Uxbridge Pool. Hillingdon Swimming Club is looking to build an Olympic Disabled Swimming Team for 2012 and as a consequence we are looking at a closer relationship with the mainstream club going forward.

Waitrose Ruislip

Waitrose Ruislip celebrated the 1st anniversary of their Community Matters Scheme on Wednesday 21st October. Rosemary Noyes, Sylvia Smith and Anne Rourke represented the Turtles at the event and had their photograph taken by the local press. Earlier this year Waitrose Community Matters donated £260 to the Turtles for purchase of the 'Helper' swimshirts.

Evacuation Drill

In August we carried out a successful evacuation of the pool. The drill highlighted some areas of weakness and confusion and we will be organising another drill in the future with the co-operation of the Highgrove management. It is important that we carry out these drills so that we are prepared should there ever be an emergency or a need to evacuate the pool when our club is in session.

Turtles Invitation Gala & Region I NASCH Championships Results (Saturday 19th September)

It was the responsibility of the Turtles to host the Region I NASCH Gala for 2009 as the Turtles were the 2008 Region I Champions. So the gala this year was a combined event of the Invitation Gala and the NASCH Region I Final.

Harrow Kingfishers won the Invitation Gala, the Turtles team finished 4th.

Watford Sea Lions won the Region I Trophy and will now host the event in September 2010. The Turtles were 3rd in the Regional Gala.

These are mainly run under the auspices of the National Association of Swimming Clubs for the Handicapped (NASCH) and include the Annual Club Championships, friendly races against other clubs in the local region as well as the National Gala usually held in November at Leamington Spa. Badges for distance swimming are also available and every year the club participates in the British Long Distance Swimming Association 'postal swim' involving other swimming clubs throughout the country

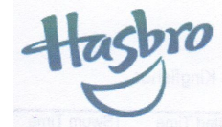
