Thanks to the grant we received from Grass Roots we will not be charging for the hire of the special coach with wheelchair lift but we will of course have to charge for the cost of admission to Longleat. A Passport ticket for all the major attractions would normally cost £24 but our group will only have to pay £13 per person (£9 for children under 14). More about Longleat (from their guidebook)

As featured on BBC's Animal Park and widely recognised as one of the best loved tourist destinations in the UK, Longleat offers the adventure of a lifetime in this wonderland of attractions.

Set within 900 acres of 'Capability' Brown landscaped grounds, Longleat House is widely regarded as one of the best examples of high Elizabethan architecture in Britain and one of the most beautiful stately homes open to the public. Visited by Elizabeth in 1574, Longleat House was built by Sir John Thynne from 1568 and is the home of the 7th Marquess of Bath. Longleat House contains many treasures including Titan's Rest on the Flight into Egypt', exquisite Flemish tapestries, fine French furniture, as well as elaborate ceilings by John Dibblee Grace inspired by palaces of Renaissance Italy.

In April 1966, the Safari Park became the first of its kind to open outside of Africa and began a revolution in zoological collections that has since spread around the globe.

Only 3 wheelchairs are allowed on any one floor at any one time and it is only possible to have a total of 6 wheelchairs in the House at any one

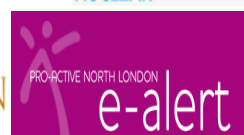
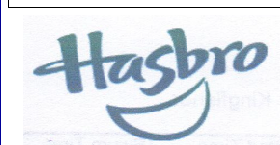
